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Hunterdon Medical Center Laboratory Patient Collection Instructions: Sputum Collection

Follow carefully the instructions below. This will greatly reduce the chance of inappropriate specimens and the need for recollection.

- 1. The specimen should be collected early in the morning.
- 2. The specimen must be collected in sterile, screw–cap sputum collection cup.
- 3. The specimen must be collected at home. For safety, the specimen will not be collected in the laboratory area.
- 4. Rinse your mouth with water. If you have dentures, remove the dentures first.
- 5. A deep cough, first thing in the morning is needed to produce the sputum sample (no post nasal drip, no spit).
- 6. Collect the specimen directly into the sterile collection cup provided.
- 7. Carefully replace the cap and tighten. Check to ensure that the cap is closed and secure.
- 8. Label the container with:
 - Patient's full name **<u>UNLABELED SPECIMENS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED</u>**
 - Date of birth
 - Date and Time of collection
- 9. Refrigerate the specimen if a delay of more than 1 to 2 hours for drop off is anticipated.
- 10. Place labeled specimens in a sealed specimen bag and return to the laboratory along with the order for the test(s) to be performed.
- **11.** *Deliver the sample within <u>24 hours of collection if refrigerated</u> and within <u>2 hours if</u> <u>held at room temperature.</u>

Notes:

- A physician order needs to accompany the specimen that is delivered to the Laboratory.
- Minimum sample amounts for:
 - 1. Bacteria culture at least 1 ml
 - 2. Fungi culture 3-5 ml
 - 3. AFB culture 5-10 ml (If the physician orders multiple tests for AFB (x3), you may be required to collect a new specimen for 2 or 3 consecutive days. Multiple specimens must be 24 hours apart. Each specimen must be labeled with date and time of collection.*

Note: *Specimens collected for AFB culture on multiple days may be held in the refrigerator and delivered to the laboratory on Day #3.
